Some join the sessions to keep skills fresh, some are beginning to learn, and others are heading towards in-club assessments. All members are welcome to join. They are approx 3 hours long, and for the most part take place in the harbour area, although some sessions go out to the bay. Our man overboard dummy "SIDney" does tireless work during these sessions!

Thanks to club Captains Gerry Flaherty, Elizabeth O'Gorman, Sonja Masterson, Pierce O'Broin and Patrick Kinsella who have given their time to facilitate these sessions for members so far.

CRUISING

If winter sailing in Ireland wasn't enough, the interest in taking to the water in even higher latitudes from the 20 plus members that showed up to a talk in the Wicklow Wolf brewery's venue and tasting room showed there's an appetite for it in SID. We were given a slideshow and Q&A session in mid November on sailing in Norway by Adrian's friend Asley Glover. Ash took us through the planning considerations and timing for a route on 'Alacrity' through the Caledonian Canal (3 to 5 days) and over to Bergen (2.5 days) in Norway. The style of tieing up up was briefly covered, plus the nature of yacht mooring locations and what you'd expect to find there, or not (as the locations are often remote from tourism hubs). The lack of shops and restaurants seems to be more than made up for in scenery, and other friendly sailors. So pack a good camera and a good cook! Only 3 days weathered out in 8 weeks of sailing is a great ratio and whetted the appetite for the destination. Thanks to Ash and Wicklow Wolf for a great evening out!

Irish Sailing Cruising Meeting

SID members were invited to meeting on Saturday 9 November organised by the new IS cruising policy group. It was an open forum to allow priority issues to be raised by members of the cruising community, with the plan to try and deal with them as a joint force with the help of IS. It was a really well run brainstorming session by a facilitator, at the end of which the following three issues were identified as the current greatest priorities for cruisers:

- Hazard posed by poorly marked and poorly laid lobster pots
- Lack of leisure marine facilities at regular intervals around the Irish coast
- Difficulty in accessing marine services at locations around Ireland
